

Trash treasure: In a Dutch museum, a technician accidentally trashed a famous artwork, mistaking it for debris. The piece, by Alexandre Lavet, mimicked dented beer cans and was part of LAM Museum's quirky exhibits that elevate everyday objects. A curator noticed it missing and recovered it just in time. Though unintentional, the museum plans to adjust displays to avoid future mix-ups. This funny slip-up shows how art can turn the ordinary into the extraordinary, sparking thought and conversation.



Rock rhythms: Lithophones—stone instruments that sing when struck—have echoed through time. One from Sudan's Fourth Cataract, made during the Kerma period (2500–1500 B.C.E.), sheds light on ancient rituals. This granite slab, marked with percussion zones, was tapped to produce rich tones during gatherings. Its worn surface speaks to its cultural importance and lasting use. These melodic stones show how music has long connected people through shared experience and ceremony.

Justice fulfilled: A Brazilian woman turned tragedy into purpose after her father was murdered in a bar dispute. The killer fled and evaded justice for decades. Driven by a promise to her family, she became a police officer and pursued the fugitive relentlessly. Her efforts led to his arrest on a remote farm, finally delivering justice. Her story is a testament to resilience and the enduring power of love and commitment.

Illusion artistry: British sculptor Alex Chinneck transforms the ordinary with mind-bending illusions. From melting façades to twisting architecture, his playful public art amazes viewers. Formerly a painter, he found his passion in sculpture at Chelsea College of Arts, using bricks, glass, and more. Works like a building split open or a shattered warehouse blend history with surrealism. With projects across the U.K. and beyond, Chinneck's imagination continues to defy expectations.




